

Domestic Trip Tracker – August Bank Holiday 2020

Topline Results

- 9% of adults in Britain definitely plan to take a <u>holiday</u> in the UK over the August Bank Holiday (4.8M adults) and 9% definitely plan to take a <u>holiday</u> in England (4.5M adults). This corresponds to an estimated spend of £1.2 billion in the UK, and £1.1 billion in England alone.
- This is a significantly lower level than August 2019, where 17% 'definitely' planned to take a holiday in the UK, and 16% 'definitely' planned to take a holiday in England.
- In total, 10% of British adults 'definitely' plan to take an <u>overnight trip</u> over the August bank holiday weekend, and 13% are undecided.
- Among those who are planning or considering an overnight trip, 56% are planning a holiday or short break, and 35% plan to visit friends and relatives.
- 12% of Brits will 'definitely' take a <u>day trip</u> over the August bank holiday weekend, and a further 26% 'might or might not'.

Approach and Sample

VisitEngland commissions online omnibus surveys periodically in order to collect data on the number of GB consumers who plan to take an overnight trip at key times throughout the year.

In this August 2020 edition, the survey was carried out on an online omnibus by the research agency Kantar, with a representative sample of 1252 adults aged 16 and over in Great Britain.

The fieldwork for the survey took place between the 20th and 24th August 2020. The August 2020 Bank Holiday falls on the 31st of August. Comparisons have been made to the August Bank Holiday weekend in 2019, when the Bank Holiday fell on the 26th of August.

Key Insights

Overnight Trips

- 10% of British adults 'definitely' plan to take an overnight trip over the August bank holiday weekend, while a further 13% 'might or might not'. This is compared to 22% 'definitely' planning a trip and 16% saying they 'might or might not' take one in 2019.
- Among those who are planning or considering an overnight trip, 56% are planning a holiday or short break (compared to 59% in 2019), while 35% are planning to visit friends and relatives (compared to 40% in 2019).
- Men (12%) are more likely to be planning or considering a trip than women (8%), and those aged 25 to 34 (28%) are also more likely to be planning or considering a trip than other age groups (16-24, 35-54, 55+). Those with children (21%) are more likely to be planning or considering a trip than those without (7%). As has been the case in previous years, those living in Greater London (22%) are the most likely to be planning or considering a trip.
- Among the 13% that are still undecided as to whether they will take an overnight trip for the bank holiday weekend, the most common reason for waiting is 'waiting to see what the weather is like' (30%), however



concerns around coronavirus/Covid-19 is a close second (28%). 1 in 5 (21%) are concerned about possible travel restrictions.

Holiday Trips

- 9% will 'definitely' take a holiday or short break in England, while 16% 'definitely' or 'might' take a holiday in England over the bank holiday weekend.
 - 13% 'definitely' or 'might' take a short break of three nights or less in England
 - 10% 'definitely' or 'might' take a longer 4+ night break in England
- 6% will 'definitely' take a holiday trip abroad, while 10% 'definitely' or 'might' take a holiday abroad.
 - 8% 'definitely' or 'might' take a short break of three nights or less abroad
 - 8% 'definitely' or 'might' take a longer 4+ night break abroad
- The proportion of Brits 'definitely' planning a holiday in England over the bank holiday weekend has decreased from 2019. The proportion of Brits 'definitely' planning a holiday abroad has also decreased since 2019.

Day Trips

- 12% of adults in Britain will 'definitely' take a day trip over the bank holiday weekend, and a further 26% 'might or might not'. This is at a lower level in than in 2019 (24% 'definitely'; 29% 'might or might not').
- Those aged 16-34 are more likely to be planning or considering a day trip (62%) than those aged 35-54 and 55+ (33% and 25% respectively), and those with children are more likely to be planning or considering a day trip (59%) than those without (32%). Those living in Greater London are most likely to be planning or considering a day trip over the bank holiday weekend (52%).
