Our CEO Jonathan Neame is the fifth generation of his family to lead the business and has been with the company since 1991.





Shepherd Neame brews around 60 million pints of beer a year from its base in Faversham – this includes traditional classics such as Spitfire and Bishops Finger along with newer brands like Whitstable Bay and Bear Island.

The Company owns and operates 316 pubs and hotels across the South East of England.
